#### NAWCC Field Suitcase Workshops – Update By: Tom Noesges

As of this writing (September 15, 2008), we have seven students signed up to take the Field Suitcase Workshop "Introduction to Basic Time & Strike ... The American Kitchen Clock" (F101). This workshop is scheduled for Friday, October 31, 2008 through Monday, November 3, 2008. We still have room for two more students. Should we have more folks interested than class space, we will wait-list overflow students for an F101 workshop to be scheduled for mid to late 2009.

Joel Dunipace will be the NAWCC instructor for this class. Joel is a resident of Ocean Springs, MS and has taught many of the FSW classes. Additionally, Joel has received NAWCC training and certification as an instructor and has many years of repair experience. The "Introduction to Basic Time & Strike ... The American Kitchen Clock" workshop will be a mostly hands-on experience covering the basics of clock repair. Because of the high instructor/student ratio, expect lots of personal attention from the instructor. The workshop is intended for the hobbyist who wants to maintain his own clocks. Even so - many who have taken this course have gained sufficient knowledge to start their own business. In addition to proper cleaning and assembly techniques, the student will be taught bushing and broaching pivot holes, lubrication and oiling, straightening and polishing pivots, straightening teeth and arbors, lantern pinion repair, verge and crutch repair and adjustment, escapement drop correction, beat setting, time regulation, strike adjustments, click repair, time and strike mechanisms concepts, beat and spring calculations and trouble shooting.

At the completion of the workshops, certificates suitable for framing are issued. However, to gain certification as a clockmaker from an accredited institution, you must complete the prescribed curriculum at the NAWCC School of Horology in Columbus, PA.





Thanks to our dear friend, fellow member and auctioneer Brooks Coleman, we have secured a beautiful classroom located in the Activity Building at the City of Duluth facility in Duluth, Georgia. And – we owe a big Thank You to our very own Chapter 24 for covering the rental expense for this wonderful and convenient facility.

The next two classes planned by our chapter are: F102 - Time & Strike Clocks with Spring Barrels for January 2009 and F103 - Introduction to Chime Clocks for March 2009. Beyond these two classes, we have no firm plans. One of our members has expressed interest in Reverse Glass Painting (F401) and another member asked about Introduction to Basic Watch Repair ... The American Pocket Watch (F301). 
Carol Tekippe called the meeting to order and recognized new guests.

Many people have come to call any large old pocket watch, especially one with an engraving of a locomotive on the back


of the case, a railroad watch. This usage is frequently is incorrect. The term "Railroad Watch" was used by the watch and jewelry trade (and is now used by collectors) to refer those high grade watches that met the requirements of railroad time service rules and standards. The railroad industry, and the railroaders themselves, referred to the watches as "Standard Watches," literally, those watches that met the railroads' time

service standards. This program, created for the Pocket Horology Chapter 174 Website (http:// www.pockethorology.org/), covered the types of watches that were accepted by the railroads as the requirements changed during the different eras.

To coordinate with the August meeting's program, the Chapter 24 Watch Focus Group will displayed standard watches that many collectors would not normally consider to be railroad watches.



From in town: Take Ponce De Leon/78 past I-285 about 6 miles; exit on Hugh Howell Rd. At Chevron station, turn right on the Lilburn-Stone Mtn. Rd. After 0.2 mile, turn right on Old Stone Mtn. Rd. At the Rockbridge inter-Section, turn left and the Aquatic Center is 2 Blocks N. of intersection on left hand side. You'll see Gregg's Nursery across the street.

From the northwest: Take I-85 east at I-285 Exit to your right at Hwy. 140, Jimmy Carter Blvd. Go 1.3 miles to Rockbridge & turn left. 2 blocks before you get to Five Forks Trickum, the Aquatic Center will be on your right.
