- President George Waterhouse called the meeting to order following the traditional auction led by Brooks Coleman.
- Mary Jones read the minutes of the June 3 2011, meeting. The minutes were unanimously approved as read.

## CASE RESTORATION ACCORDING TO GEORGE

Chapter President George Waterhouse shared his experience and expertise on the restoration and conservation of wooden cases. He discussed the importance to "first do no harm" by using techniques that are reversible as well as compatible with the techniques of the clock's era. For instance, the use of hide glue and the avoidance of





nails are two considerations. He also emphasized doing a "dry run" when reassembling parts by initially not using the glue to assure correct fit prior to the glue application. George described the process of repairing damaged veneers and showed several products that he recommends. He mentioned methods of repairing difficult veneers such as cross-banded and curved convex surfaces. Other tips included the enlarging of an irregular area of missing veneer, use of a paper pattern to guide the matching and cutting of the replacement piece, and using a double layer of replacement veneer for deep repairs. He displayed a variety of veneer materials as well as examples of case restorations that he had performed. Many thanks to George for a most informative program.

Donna Kalinkiewicz talked about her Junghans one-day time and strike clock that plays *Auld Lang Syne* on the hour.




Fred Vonn showed his handmade replacement crown carving for a Vienna Regulator, along with the original piece and the template that guided his work.



Mary Jones showed the Vienna Regulator that she purchased at the February chapter meeting as her first attempt at case restoration and movement repair.






Michael Klevickis showed his British portable shipyard time clock by Gkedhill-Brooks Time Recorders in 1929. Encased in welded and riveted, heavy gauge steel plate, the movement was also unique in its use of a fussee to maintain constant power and accurate time.

FROM THE NORTHWEST: Take the I-85 east exit from I-285. Exit 99 and turn right on Jimmy Carter (Hwy 140). Continue and bear left onto Rockbridge Rd. Aquatic Center will be on right—two blocks before Five Forks Trickum Rd.

FROM CUMMING / HALL COUNTY: Take Exit 101 Indian Trail / Lilburn Rd NW off southbound I-85. As you cross Hwy 29 Lawrenceville Rd, Indian Trail becomes Killian Hill Rd. Turn right onto Five Forks Trickum Rd. Turn right onto Rockbridge Rd. Aquatic Center is two blocks

FROM THE SOUTH (IN TOWN): Take I-285 to Exit 39B which is Highway 78, continue on 78 to Exit 7 onto Hugh Howell Road. After this exit, immediately turn right onto Lilburn-Stone Mountain Road. After 0.2 mile, turn right onto Old Stone Mountain Road. Continue to the intersection of Rockbridge and Five Forks Trickum. Turn left on Rockbridge Rd. The Aquatic Center is two blocks north on left.
