Jim Coulson showed a clock dial designed by Benjamin Franklin in 1758 with only one hand that rotates once every four hours.

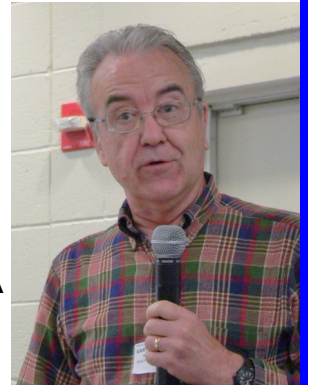
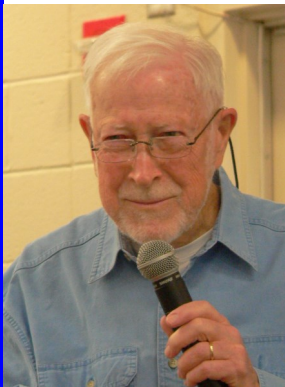
Gary Walton showed some photographs of an IBM Time Keeper restoration that he did.

Bill Knaak showed a Birge and Fuller steeple-on-steeple clock.

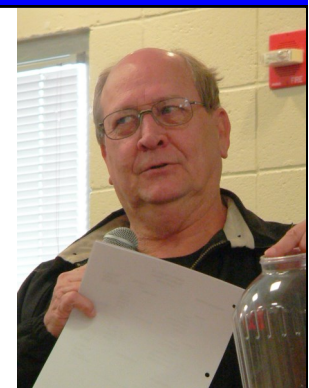
President Jae Martin adjourned the meeting.

### **From Northeast Atlanta:**

Take 85 South to 75 North  
Exit 75 North at Moores Mill Road (Exit 254)  
Turn left onto Moores Mill  
Pass thru a 4-way stop and 2 red lights  
Turn Right when Moores Mill dead-ends into West Paces Ferry Road  
The Governor's Mansion is less than ¼ mile on the left

### **From North Atlanta:**

Take 75 South  
Exit at West Paces Ferry Road (Exit 255)  
Turn left onto West Paces Ferry  
Pass thru 2 red lights  
The Governor's Mansion is approximately 2 miles down on the left

### **From South Atlanta:**

Take 75 North  
Exit at Moores Mill Road (Exit 254)  
Turn left onto Moores Mill  
Pass thru a 4-way stop and 2 red lights  
Turn Right when Moores Mill dead-ends into West Paces Ferry Road  
The Governor's Mansion is less than ¼ mile on the left. 3 miles  
Turn Right onto Peachtree Rd and continue for approximately .5 miles  
Turn Right onto West Paces Ferry Rd  
The Governor's Mansion is approximately 1.1 miles down on your Right

### **From East Atlanta:**

Take I-20 West to I-75 North.  
Exit 75 North at Moores Mill Road (Exit 254)  
Turn left onto Moores Mill  
Pass thru a 4-way stop and 2 red lights  
Turn Right when Moores Mill dead-ends into West Paces Ferry Road  
The Governor's Mansion is less than ¼ mile on the left

### **From West Atlanta:**

Take I-20 East to I-75 North.  
Exit 75 North at Moores Mill Road (Exit 254)  
Turn left onto Moores Mill  
Pass thru a 4-way stop and 2 red lights  
Turn Right when Moores Mill dead-ends into West Paces Ferry Road  
The Governor's Mansion is less than ¼ mile on the left

### **From 400s:**

Take the Lenox Rd Exit toward Buckhead  
Keep Right at the fork to go on Lenox Rd and continue for approximately .3 miles  
Turn Left onto Piedmont Rd and continue for approximately .3 miles  
Turn Right onto Peachtree Rd and continue for approximately .5 miles  
Turn Right onto West Paces Ferry Rd  
The Governor's Mansion is approximately 1.1 miles down on your Right
