Minutes of NAWCC Atlanta Meeting on December 2, 2018



Vice-President Brooks Coleman started us off with an auction and then President Jae Martin conducted the business meeting.

The minutes of the last meeting were approved by the membership, as published in the newsletter.

Jae announced the passing of Bill Milligan. It was moved and approved to have a donation made in his name to the NAWCC.



Bernie Tekippe offered some commentary on articles in a recent Horological Science Newsletter (by D.

Drumheller of New Mexico) regarding compensation for barometric pressure changes. Bernie's design effectively already cancels circular and recoil errors which account for over 90% of the error in mechanical clocks. The article proposes that barometric pressure change related and pendulum air resistance errors can additionally be minimized by reducing pendulum swing. The Newsletter also documents a demonstration of the accuracy achieved by a reproduction of a John Harrison clock to be within 1 sec/100 days. Bernie would like to perform a similar demonstration of the accuracy of his design. He stated that he needs an additional laptop computer to perform testing. Jim Coulson offered to support Bernie's demonstration.



New Officers and a Director were introduced for the 2019/2020 term including President Dan Butt, Vice President Donald Jackson, Treasurer Charles Carrol, Secretary Bob Geier and Director Bill Knaak. Jae recognized and thanked individually his team of Officers who contributed to the success of the Chapter in the past term including Vice President Brooks Coleman,



FROM THE NORTHWEST: Take the I-85 east exit from I-285. Exit 99 and turn right on Jimmy Carter (Hwy 140). Continue and bear left onto Rockbridge Rd. Aquatic Center will be on right—two blocks before Five Forks Trickum Rd.

FROM CUMMING / HALL COUNTY: Take Exit 101 Indian Trail / Lilburn Rd NW off southbound I-85. As you cross Hwy 29 Lawrenceville Rd, Indian Trail becomes Killian Hill Rd. Turn right onto Five Forks Trickum Rd. Turn right onto Rockbridge Rd. Aquatic Center is two blocks north on left.

FROM THE SOUTH (IN TOWN): Take I-285 to Exit 39B which is Highway 78, continue on 78 to Exit 7 onto Hugh Howell Road. After this exit, immediately turn right onto Lilburn-Stone Mountain Road. After 0.2 mile, turn right onto Old Stone Mountain Road. Continue to the intersection of Rockbridge and Five Forks Trickum. Turn left on Rockbridge Rd. The Aquatic Center is two blocks north on left.
